#### 1. Context and Controller

# Legal basis of the processing

#### Purpose of the processing

The aim of project is to evaluate the relevance and effectiveness of Eurojust's external communication activities. This survey is a key part of the evaluation, and collects information about targeting, messaging and communication channels related to Eurojust's communication. Responses to the survey will be used solely for this purpose.

The survey will be completed by respondents on a voluntary basis. Please note that you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. #### **Technical means**

The collected personal data and all information related to the above-mentioned survey are stored on secured and protected servers of Qualtrics (sub-processor) located in France with backups in Ireland. ICF and Qualtrics implement appropriate technical and organizational measures to ensure a level of security and confidentiality appropriate to the risk. All the information that will be collected during the course of the survey will be kept strictly confidential.

The information data subjects will submit via this survey will only be used for the purpose of obtaining anonymous feedback from them. ICF will generate a report of the results for Eurojust with only anonymized or aggregated data. Respondents will not be identifiable in any report. Only

### Types of personal data

### 3. To whom is your personal data disclosed?

Access to all personal data and information collected in the context of this survey is only granted to the core research team members of ICF. No data are transmitted to parties which are outside the recipients. ICF will not share any personal data with third parties for direct marketing purposes.

For the purpose of this survey, the Data Processor will use the Qualtrics online survey tool. This specialized online survey application is designed to be compliant with all applicable EU data protection regulations and laws. Survey data are hosted on secure servers in France with backups in Ireland.

Eurojust will have access only to the aggregated and anonymised results of the survey and will not receive any personal data.

#### 4. How can you verify, modify or delete your information?

You have the right to access, rectify or erase or restrict the processing of your personal data or, where applicable, the right to object to processing or the right to data portability in line with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

## 5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The personal data will remain in ICF's and Qualtrics' databases until the results of the survey have been completely analysed and used for the purpose of this survey. Eurojust will keep the analysis reports (aggregated data only) provided by ICF for a maximum 10 year period to ensurebenchmarking of results with future surveys.
